Process



Councils invited to submit proposals for new council footprints in their area (invitation letters).



Ministers
decide which
proposals meet
the criteria and
publish these
for statutory
consultation



Following consultation, ministers decide which proposal to take forward



Structural Changes Order is published, Section 24 direction issued



Two models for transition— shadow councils or continuing authority.



For shadow councils – shadow elections take place a year before reorganisation, with a shadow council then in place to prepare the new councils for vesting day.

LGR Toolkit

- Being developed by Local Partnerships with sector support

LGR Toolkit

The first iteration of the Toolkit will focus on the following cross-cutting themes:

- Transition planning, service delivery, continuity and compliance
- Governance
- Procurement and supplier alignment, asset management and contract transfer
- Legal services
- Communications and stakeholder engagement (including community engagement)

- Transformation (higher level content, with a focus on how to plan for the authority to be agile enough to progress transformation post vesting day)
- Elections and boundaries
- Aggregating and disaggregating services
- Digital, data and technology (this is likely to be largely covered by a forthcoming MHCLG-funded resource).
