Lee Valley Regional Park Authority's Approach

## Lee Valley Regional Park Authority

- 26 mile long, 10,000-acre park with award winning green spaces, a Riding Centre, an Athletics Centre, 3 Campsites, 2 Marinas, a working farm, a golf course and garden's
- World class sport venues such as the Lee Valley VeloPark, Lee Valley White Water Centre, the Lee Valley Hockey & Tennis Centre all used for London 2012 and the Lee Valley Ice Centre.

The aim of this presentation is to give an overview of the approach Lee Valley Regional Park Authority have taken since the announcement of 'Martyn's Law'.





Four criteria to determine whether a Premises is in scope

- Must consist of a building or a building and other land
- Must wholly or mainly be used for one or more uses specified
- 200 or more individuals present at the same time
- Not specified or described under the excluded premises

Uses that LVRPA premises are captured by:

- Entertainment and Leisure Activities
- Hotels etc. c) – a holiday park
- Public Authority – provision by a public authority of facilities or services to visiting members of the public

LVRPA - 11 premises in scope



# QUALIFYING PREMISES ASSESSMENT

Of the 11 Premises in scope, an assessment of the number of individuals expected to be present was carried out to determine whether they are captured as **Standard Duty Premises** or **Enhanced Duty Premises**.

A range of methods are detailed in the factsheet:

- A. Safe occupancy for fire safety purposes
- B. Historic attendance data
- C. Fixed seating and/or standing positions
- D. Tickets and pre-registration
- E. Restrictions
- F. Other means of assessing – if the other methodologies don't work

**LVRPA – 6 Enhanced Duty Premises & 5 Standard Duty Premises**



## Responsible Person

The Responsible Person is the individual or Organisation that has control of the premises in connection with the 'use' that qualifies the premises as being in scope

- LVRPA managed premises (campsites and marinas) – LVRPA is the Responsible Person
- LVRPA owned premises but operated by the Leisure Operator (major sports venues) – the Leisure Operator is the Responsible Person

## Senior Individual

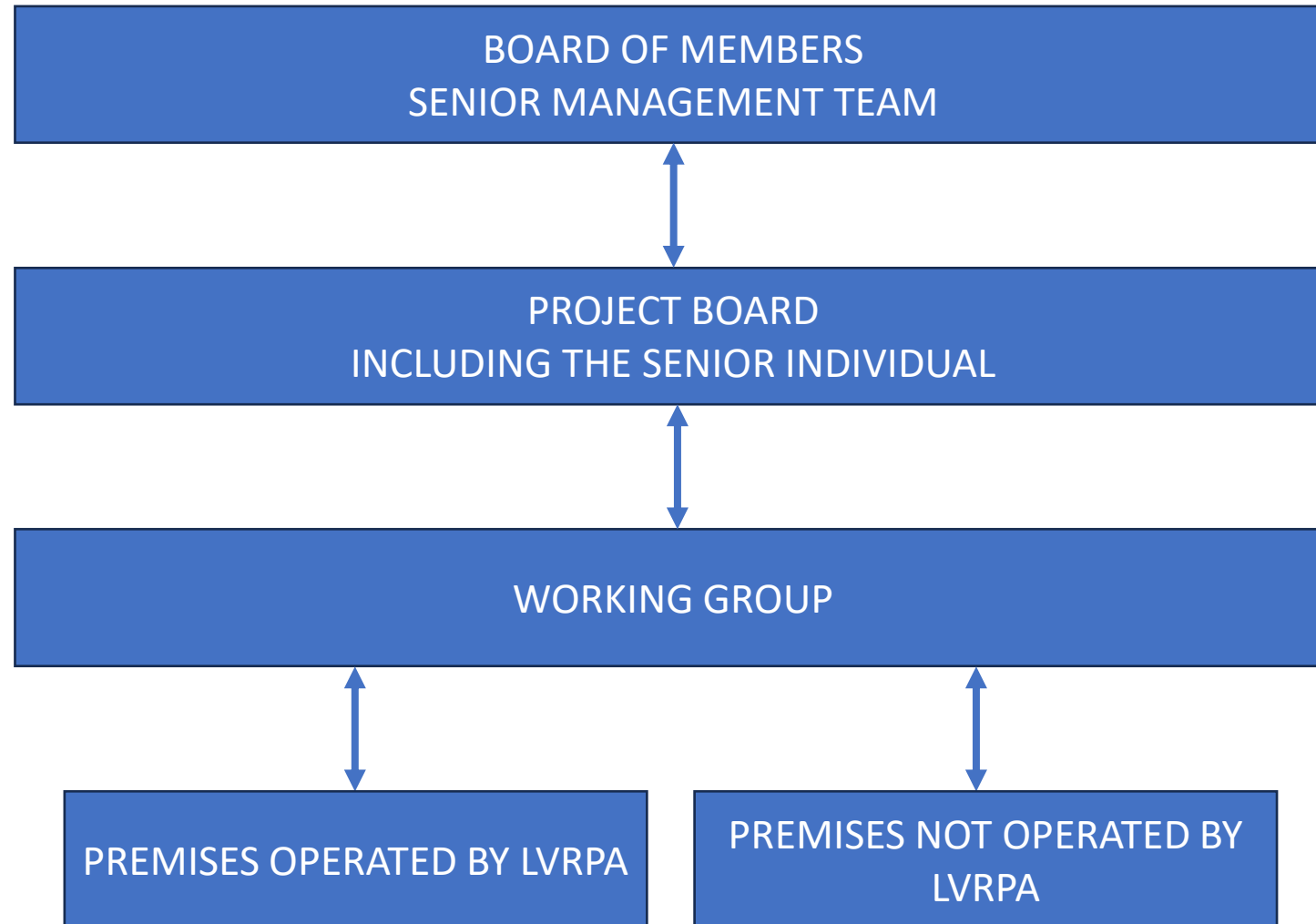
When the 'Responsible Person' for an Enhanced Duty Premises is **not an individual**. The 'Responsible Person' must designate an individual responsible for ensuring that the requirements are complied with

- LVRPA's Senior Individual is the Corporate Director

- ACT (Action Counters Terrorism) awareness e-learning is mandatory for all staff to complete annually
- See Check and Notify (SCaN) in person training is mandatory for all front of house, customer facing staff to complete annually
- Other training courses we have attended:
  - ACT Operational
  - ACT Strategic





- Reviewing Emergency Action Plans and security procedures across our premises, ensuring the four listed in the Legislation are thorough and practical
  - Evacuation
  - Invacuation
  - Lockdown
  - Mass site communication
- Developing robust testing and exercising of the above procedures
- Reviewing all security risk assessments that exist across our premises
- Developing more thorough Counter Terrorism Risk Assessment across our premises

- Waiting for regulations and guidance
- Enhanced premises – public protection measures
- Events – open-air events in the Park
- Joint responsible person? Duties of co-ordination and co-operation
  - Events?
  - Likely to be very case specific
- Assurance – how our members get assurance around our compliance – external assurance?

- Assess which Premises are in scope & the tier classification
- Identify Senior Individual
- Set up Project Group / Working Group
- Staff training – ACT and SCaN
- Review current emergency procedures
- Review security risk assessments
- Develop Counter Terrorism risk assessments
- Monitor Home Office / Protect Duty websites for updates and guidance
